P-822 MCAS TERMINAL OPERATIONS & AIRCRAFT FIRE RESCUE
COMPLEX, MARINE CORPS BASE HAWAII, KANEOHE, HAWAII

This \$47 million LEED Silver project led by dck-ecc pacific guam, LLC was the recipient of the 2015 Design-Build Institute of America National Award of Merit in the Aviation category, which attests to the success of the design-build team. RIM Architects was the Designer of Record and BASE was the structural engineer and special inspector of record.



CFSEI NATIONAL DESIGN EXCELLENCE AWARD PLAZA AT PEARL CITY, HONOLULU, HAWAII

This \$46 million, 158-bed, 107,000 SF, five-story facility was recoginized for its use of cold-formed steel framing. The building structure is primarily supported by load-bearing cold-formed steel wall framing with some structural steel framing at lower levels to transfer those bearing walls out for more open activity areas. The cold-formed steel walls are used in concert with cold-formed steel joist framing and SURE-BOARD laminated shear panels.

COMPLETION OF GUAM REGIONAL MEDICAL CITY

DEDEDO, GUAM



Guam's newest and only private hospital in Guam opened in July. This 267,000 SF, state-of-the-art healthcare facility includes patient suites with 120-beds, 15 dedicated emergency beds, 15 intensive care rooms, eight surgery rooms, a birthing center and a neonatal care unit. It is five stories tall with a partial basement at one end. The structural system consists of spread/mat foundations, cast-in-place concrete walls/columns and a precast double tee floor/roof system designed to some of the highest seismic and wind requirements in the U.S. The exterior of the facility consists of ribbon windows, curtain walls and precast concrete cladding.

TOPPING OFF OF RITZ-CARLTON RESIDENCES WAIKIKI BEACH PHASE 1 AND GROUND BREAKING OF PHASE 2

The Ritz-Carlton Residences Waikiki Beach represents the largest new resort development in Waikiki in recent times. The project includes approximately 900,000 SF of space in two complementary 37-story towers, each 350 ft. tall providing a 570 luxury units in the heart of Waikiki. The towers are joined by an expansive 500-ft. long landscaped podium at the 8th floor.

Constructed in two phases the West Tower topped off in July 2015 and is expected to be completed in mid 2016. Foundation work started on the East Tower in November 2015 and is expected to be completed in 2017.
